IV. Warnings in Favor of the Poor Man

A. <u>Give to the Poor</u>. *He that despiseth his neighbour sinneth: but he that hath mercy on the poor. happy is he.* (Proverbs 14:21)

He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again. (Prov 19:17)

He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse. (Proverbs 28:27)

B. You Will Reproach God.

1. When you oppress the poor. *He that oppresseth the poor reproacheth his Maker: but he that honoureth him hath mercy on the poor.* (Proverbs 14:31)

2. When you mock the poor.

Whoso mocketh the poor reproacheth his Maker: and he that is glad at calamities shall not be unpunished. (Proverbs 17:5)

C. <u>You Will Reap What You Sow</u>. Whoso stoppeth his ears at the cry of the poor, he also shall cry himself, but shall not be heard. (Proverbs 21:13)

D. Rob the Poor and God Will Rob You.

Rob not the poor, because he is poor: neither oppress the afflicted in the gate: (Proverbs 22:22)

For the LORD will plead their cause, and spoil the soul of those that spoiled them. (Proverbs 22:23)

"Spoil" -To cover, defraud; rob.

IV. Warnings for the Rich Man

A. <u>Do Not Trust in Riches or You Will Fall</u>. *He that trusteth in his riches shall fall: but the righteous shall flourish as a branch*. (Proverbs 11:28)

B. <u>Do Not Oppress the Poor to Increase Your Riches</u>. *He that oppresseth the poor to increase his riches, and he that giveth to the rich, shall surely come to want.* (Proverbs 22:16)

C. Do Not Give to the Rich.

He that oppresseth the poor to increase his riches, and he that giveth to the rich, shall surely come to want. (Proverbs 22:16)

D. <u>Do Not Labor to be Rich</u>. *Labour not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom*. (Proverbs 23:4)

Wilt thou set thine eyes upon that which is not? for riches certainly make themselves wings; they fly away as an eagle toward heaven. (Proverbs 23:5)

E. <u>Do Not Make Haste to be Rich</u>. *A faithful man shall abound with blessings: but he that maketh haste to be rich shall not be innocent.* (Prov 28:20) *He that hasteth to be rich hath an evil eye, and considereth not that poverty shall come upon him.* (Proverbs 28:22)

V. <u>A Poor Man is Better</u>

A. <u>Than A Fool if He Has Integrity.</u> *Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity, than he that is perverse in his lips, and is a fool.* (Proverbs 19:1)

B. <u>Than a Liar</u>.

The desire of a man is his kindness: and a poor man is better than a liar. (Proverbs 19:22)

C. <u>Than a Rich Man Who Walks Uprightly.</u> *Better is the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than he that is -perverse in his ways, though he be rich.* (Proverbs 28:6)
