THURSDAY EVENINGS

7:00 PM Science of Genesis (H&S201)

Understanding Genesis 1-11 in a historical and scientific context. The course contrasts competing paradigms for understanding Genesis and assesses how available scientific evidence is understood in each paradigm. Successful students will be able to defend a literal interpretation of Genesis based on scientific as well as scriptural evidence.

8:00 PM Church History I (H&S401)

Church History I and II examines the history of the New Testament Church from the time of Jesus Christ to present day. The student will learn about the rise of doctrinal differences and denominations, times of persecution and martyrdom, and be prepared to answer the age-old question – are Baptists Protestants? Church History I will cover the period from the establishment of the first New Testament Church by Jesus Christ through the dark ages to the beginnings of the Protestant Reformation. The course is designed for both laymen and those preparing for a career in the ministry. (Church History II will be offered in the Spring semester.)

BY ARRANGEMENT

Church Operations and Admin II (PAS202)

This course examines the practical operations, administration, and management of a local church. This includes governance, organization, delegation of authority, church finances, accountability of resources, communications, selection and training of staff and volunteers, facilities administration, and legal and risk management. The course presents Biblical principles and then examines how the principles can be applied in local churches of different sizes and situations. Second of a two-semester course.
