
RESPECT THE NAME OF GOD

BIBLE STORY

Exodus 20:7; 1 Samuel 25:1-42

A man named Nabal had great possessions in the land of Carmel. He was shearing his sheep there. His wife's name was Abigail. Nabal was hateful and evil but his wife was beautiful and an understanding woman.

David and his men watched over Nabal's sheep as his shepherds kept them. Nothing happened to them. Not one was lost.

David sent ten young men to Nabal for provisions. They said, as David told them to, "Peace be with you and your house. Your shepherds were with us and we did not hurt them. Not a sheep was lost. Now give us whatever you can."

Nabal had no respect for David. He said angrily, "Who is David? There are many runaway servants who have broken away nowadays. Shall I give to someone when I do not know from whence he came?"

The young men returned. David was angry when he heard how they had been treated. He called his men to put on their swords. They started to Nabal's house.

One of Nabal's servants went to Abigail. He told how the men who asked for provisions for David had been treated. "David's men were really good to us. They were like a wall night and day between us and danger. He is coming against our master."

Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God in vain; for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.



darn, v.t., n., adj., adv., interj. [from damn.] damn, a euphemism for the curse. [Colloq.]
